Countries that are treating marine life badly

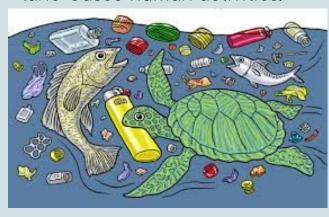

Rubbish in the sea

Plastic alone is estimated to kill 100,000 marine animals every year!!This is often due to entanglement in fishing nets and even plastic bags. However, this includes less thought-about items like straws and plastic wrap, too. You may think that the majority of the ocean pollution problem comes from fishing, and water-based activities polluting the waterways. However, only 20% of trash found in the ocean is actually from fishing and ocean activity. The other 80% is from land-based human activities.
