## Attendance

As you know, we encourage good attendance in school as it plays an important part in the overall successful outcome for your child. However, if your child is unwell it is best to keep them at home until they feel better. If your child is absent you must let the teacher know the reason for the absence using one of the following headings: illness, urgent family reason or holiday. If the absence is for another reason please give a short explanatory note to the teacher. All communication about absences can be made using Class Dojo. I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who follows this procedure whenever there is an absence.

Please note that if your child is absent for 20 days or more the school has to report this

information to the Child and Family Agency's educational welfare services. Therefore, having an explanation for each absence is important. More information on attendance and the role of Tusla and its educational welfare services can be found here.
