#### Free Books Scheme

This week the Minister of Education announced that the free books scheme for primary schools will continue next year. All schools have been asked to send this letter home to parents. I would just like to add, for your information, that this year's grant to all primary schools is €16 per child less than last year.

### **Primary Curriculum Developments**

I included this in the last newsletter and am keeping it in this one as well.

The primary curriculum is being currently updated in many subject areas.. New curriculums in English and Irish have been introduced already and a new Maths curriculum will be introduced from next September. In the coming years new curriculums will be introduced in Arts Education, Social & Environmental Education, Science, Technology & Engineering and Wellbeing, while a modern foreign language is also to be introduced. The National Council for Curriculum and Assessment is responsible for the design and implementation of these new curriculums. It is currently running a consultation process on all of this and parents are welcome to take part in this consultation.
