

Children to be collected from where they were dropped off in the morning.

- On arrival children will go directly to their classrooms via their designated entry point.
- Pupils should only be dropped at the school during their designated drop off slot.
- No children can be dropped to school before 9am.
- Staff will be at the drop off points to guide children to their entry doors.
- It is important that drop off and pick up are done both quickly and safely while at all times adhering to 2m distance as per government guidelines.
- There should be no congregation at the school gates.

Masks

As before, children in primary school are not required to wear masks. However, if you want your children to wear a mask they are free to do so. Please inform the class teacher if your child will be wearing a mask throughout the day.

What Covid symptoms to look out for.

In order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 it is important to know and recognise the symptoms of coronavirus (which includes the DELTA variant).

Common symptoms of coronavirus include:

- a fever (high temperature 38 degrees Celsius or above).
- a new cough this can be any kind of cough, not just dry.

- shortness of breath or breathing difficulties.
- loss or change in your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
- Fatigue
- Aches and Pains

Other uncommon symptoms of coronavirus include:

- · sore throat
- · headaches
- runny or stuffy noses
- feeling sick or vomiting
- · diarrhoea

Infection with the virus that causes COVID-19 can cause illness, ranging from mild to severe, It can take up to 14 days for symptoms to show. They can be similar to symptoms of <u>cold</u> and <u>flu</u>.

If you have any symptoms of COVID-19 (coronavirus), <u>self-isolate</u> (stay in your room) and phone your family doctor straight away to see if you need <u>a free COVID-19 test</u> and of course **do not come to school.**

Getting an early diagnosis means you can get the help you need and take steps to avoid spreading the virus, if you have it.

For the complete list of symptoms, please refer to the HSE <u>Website</u>. Symptoms may be subject to change so regular review of the HSE Website is advised. If you **do not** have symptoms, you can get a free COVID-19 (coronavirus) test at a <u>COVID-19 walk-in test centre</u>

Dealing with a Suspected Case in School

- If your child develops symptoms during the school day, they will be brought to a separate room to other students.
- Their temperature will be taken.
- Parents will be contacted to collect the child.
- Parents should contact their GP who will advise the next steps to be taken.

School Response to a Confirmed Covid-19 Case

- The HSE will inform any staff or parents of children who have come into close contact with a diagnosed case via the contact tracing process.
- The HSE will contact all relevant persons where a diagnosis of Covid -19 is made.
- The instructions of the HSE should be followed and pupil and staff confidentiality is essential at all times.

The three points above are taken directly from the Dept.of Education guidance to schools and will be strictly followed in the event of a confirmed case.

- As always we want to keep good lines of communication between home and school.
- Please ensure we have your correct contact details.
- All meetings/phone discussions with teachers will be by pre-arranged appointment only.
- Parents should first call the office at 057 9343754 before leaving in a forgotten lunch box or if a child needs to be collected early.
- All class teachers will continue to use Class Dojo and will be in touch with you about this.to get it set up.
