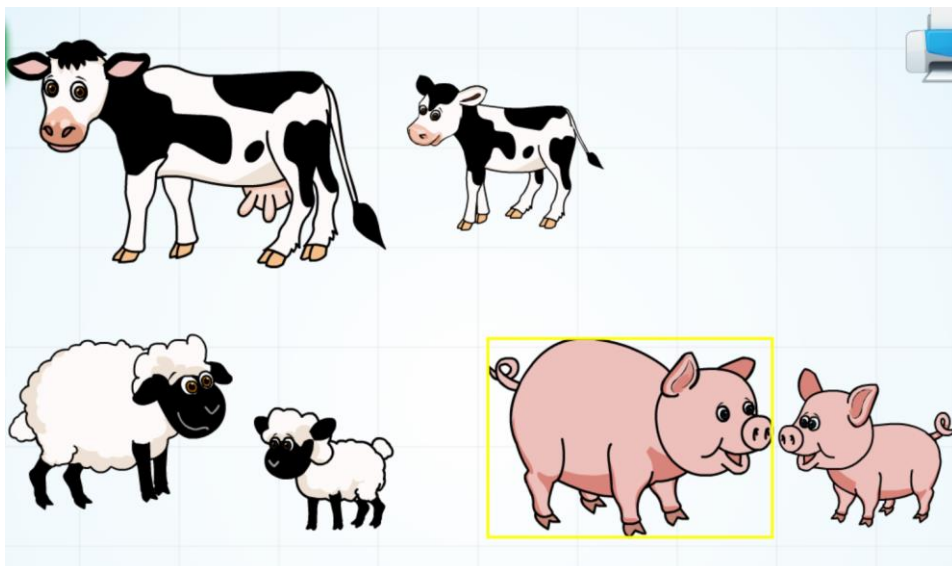

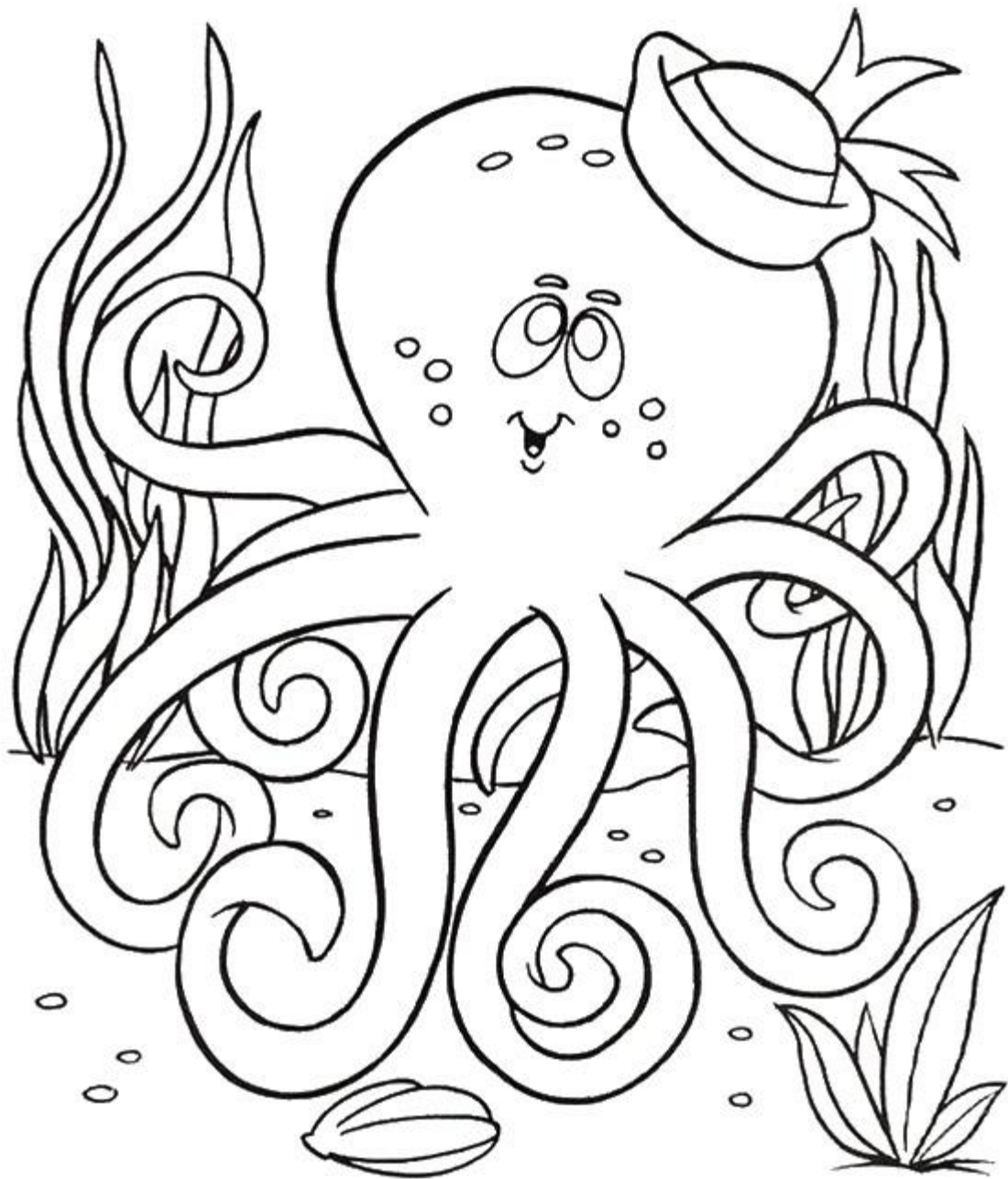
Ollie the Octopus
